At length I have obtained maps from Morgan Pavement for this year's slurry seal project... which essentially includes doing all of the streets in the Madison Addition.

The first map in the attached PDF file shows in orange color the streets that are scheduled to be done on Monday, August 14. The contractor plans on beginning work around 8 AM. I plan on being there to get things properly started.

The second page likewise shows the streets scheduled to be done on Tuesday, August 15.

The third page shows that the loop road is scheduled to be done on Wednesday and Thursday, August 16 and 17. On Wednesday they will do the outer side of the loop and traffic can use the one remaining lane to get around if need be – but must stay off and not cross the newly completed work. On Thursday they will do the inner side of the loop and then be completed with the project.

It takes about 3-4 hours for the material to properly cure and harden before it can safely be driven on (more in the cooler morning hours)...and even then people still need to be very careful not to crank their tires too hard on the newly completed slurry seal, which will just break things up and ruin the product.

It's also very important that people not walk across the newly completed slurry seal as it will get sticky black tar on the bottoms of their shoes which will track onto sidewalks/driveways, and potentially into homes, and is very difficult to remove.


The contractor places large orange traffic cones to indicate closure of the street and it would be appreciated if residents would not try to drive on those closed streets until the contractor has removed the orange cones and opened the streets back up to traffic.

We recognize that this will cause some brief inconvenience for several, but if it's only a few hours or a day once every 7-10 years, and if it results in producing a good driving surface and lengthening the life of the street, certainly people would be expected to be patient and understanding.
